

What is prevention?



Types of effective prevention:

Center for Substance Abuse Prevention

- Information Dissemination
- Education
- Alternatives
- Problem ID and Referral
- Community Based Process
- Environmental











Ineffective prevention:

- Information dissemination alone
- Alternatives alone
- One time only presentations
- Scare tactics
 - Mock crash
 - Sensationalized Posters
 - Recovery speeches
 - Grim Reaper day
 - Scared straight



Scare tactics; what does the research say?

- Fear often changes attitude and intention but often not behavior
- A meta analysis of over 100 studies on scare tactics found:
 - Fear appeals are more effective for one time only behaviors (screenings) vs. repeated behaviors (dieting)
 - Fear appeals are more effective for detection behaviors (screenings) vs. prevention/promotion behaviors (vaccines)
